Foreign vessels on cruise

2021

In 2021, foreign vessels realised 63 cruises in Montenegro. Total of 9 067 passengers arrived during these cruises.

By flag of vessels, the structure of foreign vessels on cruise entered internal sea waters of Montenegro in 2021 was the following: Malta (27,0%), Belgium (20,6%), Croatia (20,6%), Norway (17,5%), Bahamas (6,3%), Netherlands (3,2%), France (3,2%) and United Kingdom (1,6%).

Graph 1. Number of cruises and passengers on foreign vessels on cruise in Montenegro



METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

Survey on cruises of foreign vessels aims to provide data on number of realised cruises of foreign vessels entering in the internal sea waters of Montenegro, as well as number of passengers on these cruises. The data collection is done by reporting method (TU-19 form). Reporting units are seaports. The report filled for the first entry of vessel in the internal sea waters of Montenegro

A journey is an entry of a foreign vessel on cruise into the first seaport of the internal sea waters of the Montenegro.

A passenger is any person who arrived by ship irrespective of age providing that he/she is not a crew member.

The last published data are considered preliminary, and become final within the defined deadline, as foreseen by the Statistical Release Calendar.

The data are published in line with the Statistical Release Calendar.
