

1. Introduction – Basic information on survey

1.1 Purpose, goal, and subject of survey

The purpose of survey is to collect the data on reported minor perpetrators of criminal offenses, and which are an important instrument for monitoring crime as a negative social phenomenon. The main content of the obtained data: reported minor - sex, age, criminal offense, the measures during the preparatory process, types of decisions: process is not running, preparatory proceedings were suspended, filed a motion for execution of sentence-measures, length of detention.

1.2 Legal basis

The Law on Official Statistics and Official Statistical System (Official Gazette of Montenegro No 18/12 and 47/19) defines provisions for collection, processing, and dissemination of data. The Law provides to the Statistical Office clear and wide legal powers to collect and access the data necessary for the implementation of Programme and Annual Plan. The Law gives a priority to the use of administrative data and right of access to individual data that are a result of survey of other official statistical producers.

1.5 Reference geographical area

Montenegro.

1.6 Concepts and definitions

Juvenile perpetrators of a crime are persons who reached the age of 14 but not yet 18 at the time of committing the crime, and against whom legal proceedings have not been initiated (criminal charges dropped) or preparatory proceedings have been suspended; the charge motion for pronouncing the sentence / measures has been submitted, legal proceedings in the juvenile court suspended and against whom the sanctions have been imposed.

Juvenile who reached the age of 14 but not yet 16 at the time of committing the crime, and who cannot be punished but correctional measures can be imposed on him, is considered a *younger juvenile*.

A juvenile who reached the age of 16 but not yet 18 and who can be sentenced to a juvenile prison, is considered an *elder juvenile*.

Reported juvenile is an underaged person against whom legal proceedings have not been initiated (criminal charges dropped), and against whom preparatory proceedings are suspended or the charge motion submitted to a juvenile court for pronouncing a sentence or correctional measures.

The data on perpetrators of criminal offences are collected by regular annual statistical surveys, on the basis of individual statistical questionnaires.

3. Accuracy and reliability

3.1 Accuracy – overall

The data on perpetrators of criminal offences are collected by regular annual statistical surveys, on the basis of individual statistical questionnaires filled by competent state prosecutor's offices (basic and high). Statistical surveys encompass minor perpetrators of criminal offences. Data on minor offenders at the Special State Prosecutor's Office are not included.

This approach ensures high accuracy.

4. Timeliness and punctuality

4.1 Timeliness

The data are published in accordance with the Annual Plan of Official Statistics and the Statistical Release Calendar of Statistical Office. The data are published on the date determined by the Statistical Release Calendar in the form of a regular annual release.

Time lag of final data

The number of days (or weeks or months) from the last day of the reference period to the day of publication of final results. Data of survey are published 136 days after the end of the reference period in accordance with release calendar.

4.2 Punctuality

The data is published on the day that is defined by Annual Plan of Statistical Surveys and Statistical Release Calendar.

Indicator TP3 is 0, i.e. there is no difference between planned and actual announcement.

5. Availability and clarity

5.1 Statistical Release Calendar

The Law on Official Statistics and Official Statistical System (Official Gazette of Montenegro No 18/12, and 47/19) stipulates that official statistical producers prepare, update, and publish Statistical Release Calendar. It is published on the website of Statistical Office not later than 20 December for the next year, for all official statistical producers that includes date of releasing statistical data. Any change in date of releasing in the Calendar is published in advance in accordance with the Procedure on Unplanned Revisions.

5.6 Access to microdata

The Law on Official Statistics and Official Statistical System (Official Gazette of Montenegro No 18/12, and 47/19) regulates rules under which external users can obtain an access to individual data for needs of research. Article 58 defines types of scientific and research organizations that can obtain such data. Providing individual data without identifier is possible only upon a written request of scientific and research institutions, with purpose of performing scientific and research activities as well as international statistical organizations and statistical producers from other countries. Research entity signs the agreement with Statistical Office, and it signs the statement on respecting the confidentiality principle. Official statistical producers keeps a separate records on users and purpose of using the statistical data given to these users.
