

Natural movement of population and internal migration flows in 2010

The data provided by the release relate to births and deaths, marriages and divorces, as well as internal migration flows within Montenegro in 2010. Since 1 January 2010 the data source on births and deaths is the Ministry of the Interior, as the legally defined owner of vital register bureaus of births and deaths. For marriages and divorces, as well as migration flows, the source is the same as in the previous period.

The estimated number of population: for 2010 estimated number of population has been calculated on the basis of 2011 Census data, and natural increase for period June 2010 - April 2011. In this manner, on 31 June 2010 there were estimated 618 757 inhabitants.

Births: 7 420 children were born in 2010. Of the total number of births, 3 811 or 51.4% refer to male, and 3 609 or 48.6% to female persons.

Deaths: In 2010, there were 5 633 deaths. Of the total number of deceased, 2 934 or 52.1% refer to male, and 2 699 or 47.9% to female persons.

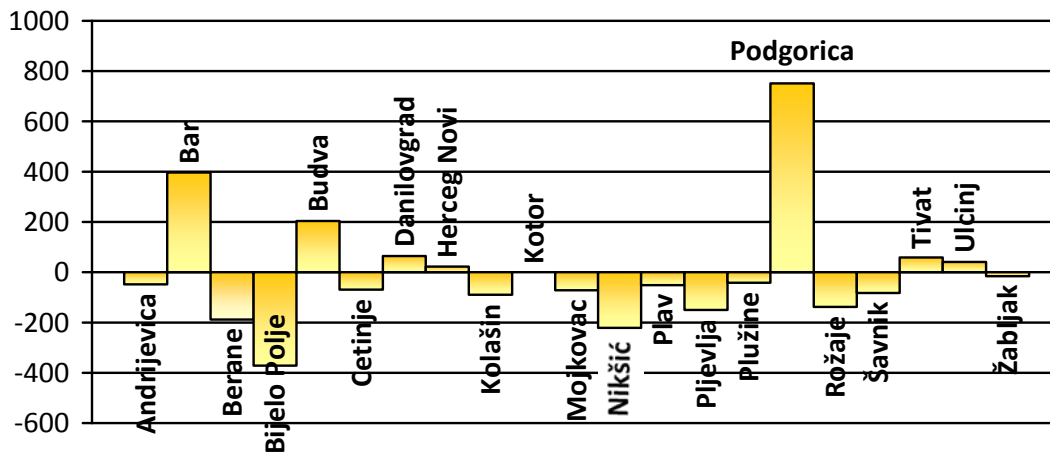
Marriages: In 2010 there were 3 675 marriages. Marriage rate (marriage per 1 000 inhabitants) in 2010 was 5.9.

Divorces: There were 520 divorces in 2010.

Internal migrations: In 2010, of 21 municipalities, more persons immigrated than emigrated in 10 municipalities, while a negative net migration was recorded in 11 municipalities.

METHODOLOGICAL EXPLANATIONS

Sources and methods for data collection

The data on births, deaths, and migration flows are submitted by the Ministry of the Interior, and the data on marriages are collected and submitted by the register bureaus. The data on divorces are submitted by courts.

Coverage

The statistics on births covers live births and still births registered in the Ministry of the Interior. The statistics of deaths also cover every case of death registered in the Ministry of the Interior. The statistics on marriages cover marriages legally registered i.e. entered in the register of marriages. The statistics of divorces cover divorces done by the responsible court.

Within the processing of statistical surveys, the results of these surveys are presented according to the place of permanent residence (of mother of born child, deceased, bridegroom, and for divorces the last place of residence of divorced couple), which is in accordance with the concept so called permanent population applied in censuses.

Definitions

Vital statistics

A live born child is the one showing life signs after birth (such as breathing, i.e. heart beating) even for a very short period, regardless of mother's pregnancy duration.

A stillborn is a child born or taken out from mother's body showing no life signs, provided that pregnancy lasted at least 28 weeks.
