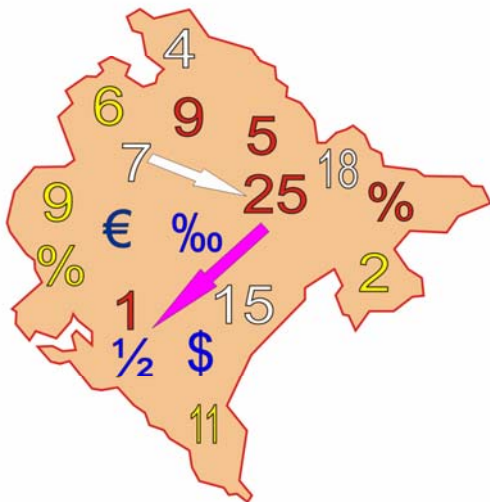

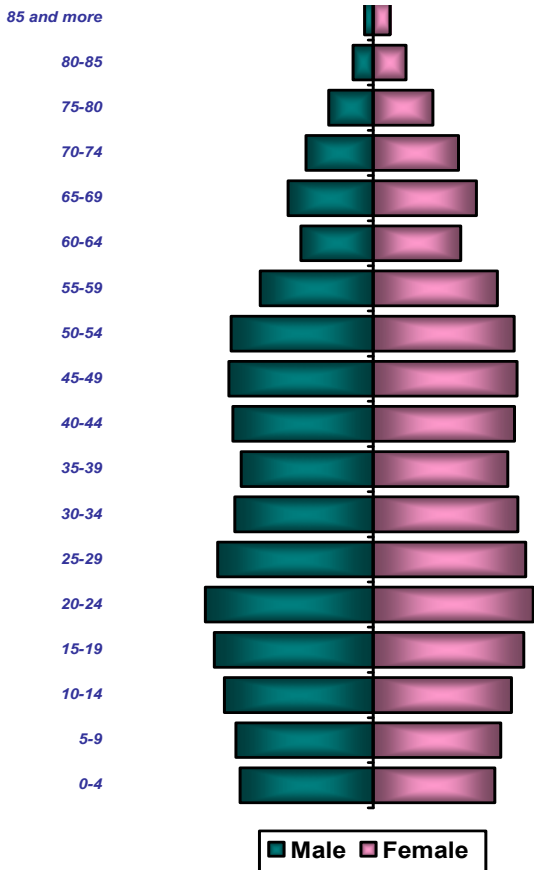

Population by age, 1st January, 2007

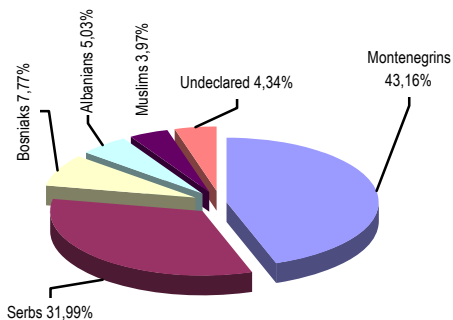

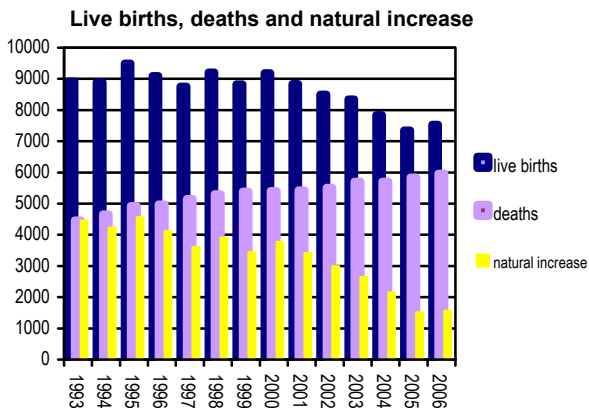

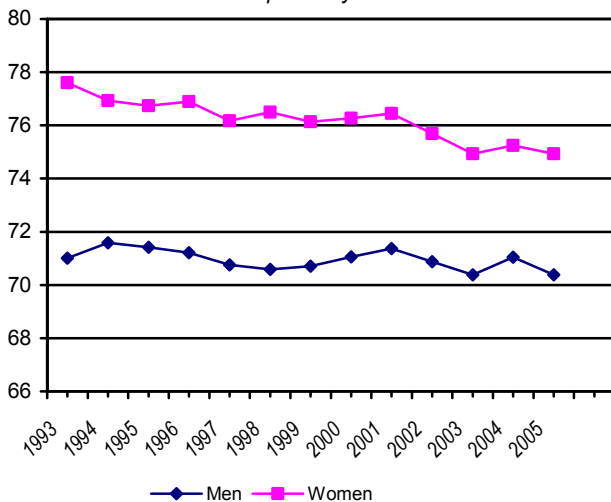

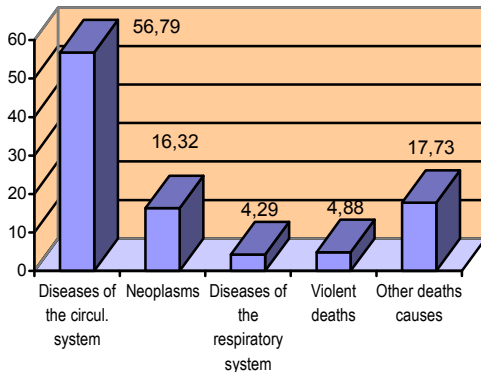

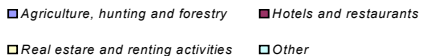

Gross value added, current prices, 2005



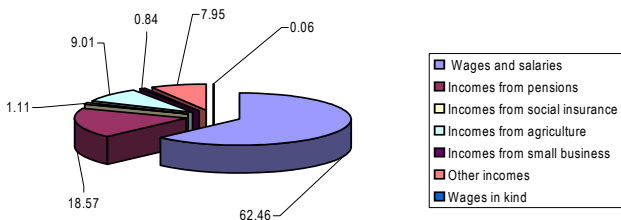

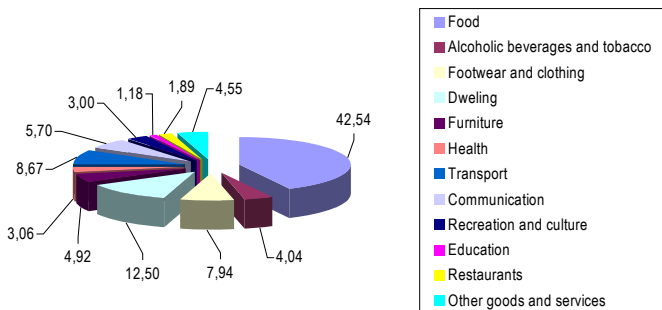
